Requirements for Becoming a Volunteer

The potential volunteer may be required to complete the following:

- Interview
- Volunteer Application
- Background Investigation
- General Orientation
- Job Specific Competencies

This process is not only meant to ensure the safety and well being of our Veterans and their families but provide a successful volunteer experience.



Volunteer Assignments: The VA has many volunteer opportunities for you, your family, friends, and co-workers. Assignments may vary from facility to facility but your involvement can make a real difference in the life of a Veteran. Below are a few main assignments. Other assignments include Office Support Assistant, Lab Assistant, Meal Time Companion and many more...

Information Desk

Greet patients and visitors, provide direction and information to guests entering the hospital.

Guest Services Ambassador

Deliver personal hygiene items, magazines, and stationary related items to all inpatients.

Volunteer Driver

Provide transportation for patients to and from the medical facility from the parking lots.

Adaptive Sports

Volunteers with experience in various indoor/outdoor sports teach Veterans.

Patient Escort

Assist Veterans to and from appointments via wheelchair or gurney.

Hospice Companion

Provide comfort and support to terminally ill Veterans and their families.

Patient Feeding

Assist staff in feeding Veterans who are not physically capable of feeding themselves.

Summer Youth Volunteer Program

For those age 14 - 17 years old; offers various service opportunities; educational and fun.
